

ORDINANCE NUMBER 380

AN ORDINANCE RESTRICTING THE OPERATION OF COMMERCIAL OR BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT IN PORTABLE BUILDINGS AND TRAILERS

WHEREAS, the use of portable buildings or trailers could create a threat to the safety of the employees and customers.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE, MISSISSIPPI:

That no commercial or business establishment may operate in a portable building or trailer unless it complies with all laws in regard to transient vendors.

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Louisville, Mississippi, now find as a fact and adjudicate that unless this ordinance takes effect immediately there will be the possibility of the denial of the ability to operate commercial or business establishments in portable buildings and trailers. Therefore, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Louisville, Mississippi, find and adjudicate that, in order to preserve public health, morals and safety and for the immediate preservation of public peace and safety, this Ordinance must be effective from and after its passage. Therefore, this Ordinance shall be and is effective from and after its passage.

The above and foregoing ordinance was first reduced to writing, read and considered by sections, then read and considered as a whole and adopted with the voting as follows:


